AVAIL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

- Caste certificate/ Family income certificate (ration card) to access multiple government scholarships
- Existing bank account to credit the scholarship funds (**This can be obtained using a bonafide letter from the school authorities)
- Get Aadhar done for the family for utilizing the credited scholarship funds
- Accompany the parents or the legal guardian on Admission day for any assistance
